- Glass jars and bottles (lids also, but separately)
- Aerosol cans (empty)
- Aluminum cans
- Paperback books

## NO, do not put these in the blue cart Put in the garbage

- Food waste
- Liquids
- \*1-Plastic bags/ loose plastic film (shrink wrap, bubble wrap, newspaper bags)
- Food tainted items-paper towels, tissue, dirty paper plates
- Dirty pizza boxes
- Juice pouches
- Dishes-plates, pots and pans, drinking glassware
- \*2-Styrofoam
- Hoses, rope, string, wire
- Tires
- Lumber, scrap metal

- Laundry baskets
- Clothing, shoes
- Carpets and textiles
- Hangers
- Lightbulbs
- \*3-Batteries, electronics
- Hazardous waste-needles, medicine, diapers, chemicals
- Flammable items-propane tanks, helium tanks
- \*4-Yard waste, plants
- Toys
- \*5-Shredded paper
- Broken hardware, ceramics, trophies, plaques, construction debris
- Fast food containers, chip bags, candy wrappers
- Anything under 2" in diameter
- Plastic silverware
- Plastic drinking straws
  - \*1-Plastic bags and loose plastic film can be brought to Publix, the CCCs, or the Land Fill for recycling
  - \*2-Styrofoam egg cartons and clean meat trays can be brought to Publix for recycling
  - \*2-White Styrofoam sheets can be brought to the Customer Convenience Centers or the Main County Landfill for recycling
  - \*3-Batteries, electronics, propane tanks can be brought to the CCCs or the Land Fill
