ABOUT THE ARTISTS

Geddes Levenson and Annie Blazejack grew up in Miami, Florida, a city of mythical storms, sci-fi lizards, and sentient swamps.

Their art practice is exclusively collaborative, and they have been making work together for over a decade. Their art-making is feminist, based in consensusbuilding rather than individual impulse. Together, they spawn ideas neither person could independently invent.

They use their art to explore the relationship between humans and ecosystems as climate change becomes increasingly inevitable.



Blazejack received her M.F.A. from The School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston/ Tufts University in 2013, and Levenson received her M.F.A. from Pratt Institute, Brooklyn, NY in 2014.

The duo has been creating and exhibiting together for more than a decade, with past shows at venues such as The Contemporary Art Museum in Raleigh, NC; the National Liberty Museum in Philadelphia, PA; the Art and Culture Center in Hollywood, FL; and the Deering Estate in Miami, FL, among others.
